

York County Beginner Bee School Fall 2012

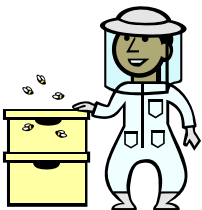
Where: Downstairs Classroom in the Anderson Learning Center,

Course Fee: \$90 - includes beginning beekeeping textbooks, other materials, and a 1-year membership in the York County Beekeepers Association. A reduced fee of \$50 applies to one of a pair of students who choose to share the text and materials (\$140/pair).
